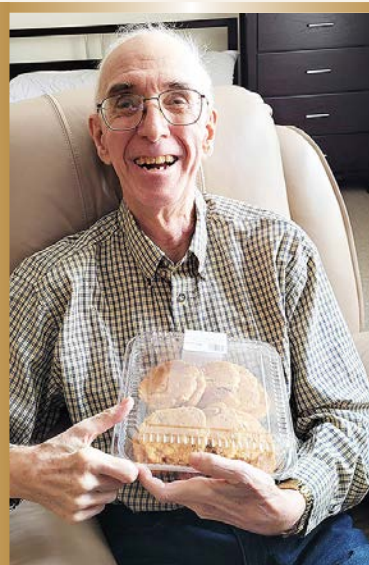
Busy Days Spent Together
