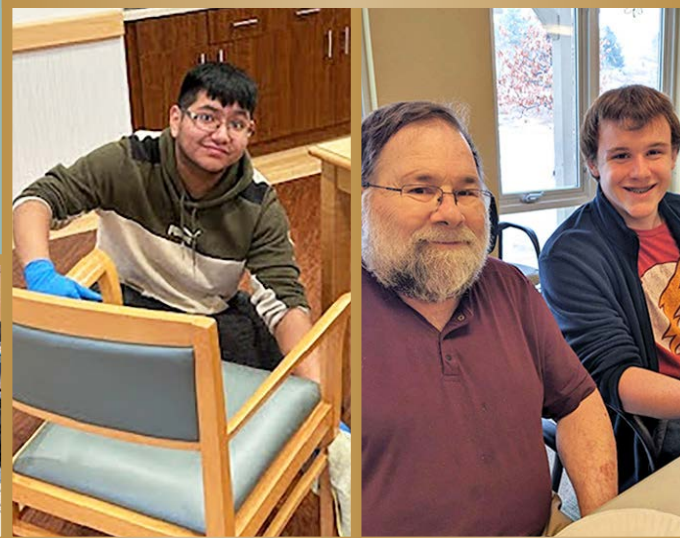


A Memorable Afternoon
